BAS PURE Marque Declaration:

To be eligible to use the BAS Pure Fibre Marque **you must** be able to agree the following:

- 1) I am a current British Alpaca Society member
- 2) The animals from whom the fibre has been shorn are registered (or notified) with the BAS
- 3) The fibre has been grown, harvested, processed and made up in the UK (you may be required to provide proof of provenance by way of invoicing, accounts etc) and your attention is drawn to the consideration of false advertising.
- 4) **Composition is not less than 100% British alpaca (either huacaya or suri or a blend of the two) excluding trimmings, buttons, handles etc**
- 5) I agree to uphold the above statements and help to prevent misuse.

The Fibre Marques maybe used on any / all products created from your raw fibre including yarns, textiles, cloth, furnishings, so long as all the above criteria are met (excluding finishings / accessories such as buttons, zips etc) It is your responsibility to ensure the provenance and purity of the goods you display the fibre marque on. As with the BAS logo, you may use either of the fibre marques in either orientation to promote / advertise your products.

Any dispute regarding the use of either Fibre Logo must be made in writing, complete with a sample and a non-refundable payment of £250
